



### **Monday: Ezekiel 35**

1. Mount Seir is a geographical reference to a mountainous region inhabited by the Edomites, who were descendants of Esau. This is the second prophecy in Ezekiel that speaks against Edom. What reasons does God give for judging Edom?
2. Part of God's covenant with Abraham was, "I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse." (Gen 12:1-3) How is this promise kept in this passage?
3. Even though God's people Israel became a divided kingdom, Israel to the North and Judah to the South, God's covenant stood firm. (vs. 10) Who is Edom really fighting against, and who prevails?
4. Missionary of the week: Pray for Rainbow Acres as they care for and equip for ministry physically and mentally challenged adults.

### **Tuesday: Ezekiel 36:1-15**

1. Think back on what you have read so far in Ezekiel. How has the LORD shown himself to be a jealous lover of his people, and a just judge?
2. What does God promise to Israel regarding their future?
3. How does the LORD show himself faithful to his promise? (See Gen. 12:1-3)
4. Pray for people in your Oikos or in your "5 for 5".

### **Wednesday: Ezekiel 36:16-21**

1. Why did the LORD bring judgment to his people Israel, allowing them to be scattered among the nations?
2. How did Israel's sin impact their testimony for the LORD?

3. Again Ezekiel highlights the holiness of God, as the LORD's name is holy. God's personhood, his character, is unchanging. Why would the LORD be concerned about his name? (vs. 20-21)

4. Pray for people where they work and live that they would honor God in all they do.

#### **Thursday: Ezekiel 36:22-38**

1. Why is God going to bless Israel? (vs. 22-23, 32) What does this communicate to you about the character of God?

2. What are the spiritual and physical blessing God will bring his people?

3. God has always desired his people have a heart of flesh, a soft heart towards him, rather than a hard heart, a heart of stone. (See Deut. 10:14-16) It appears Ezekiel 36:25-27 is partly fulfilled in Jesus inauguration of the new covenant (See Matt. 26:28), while the broader context of the passage finds its complete fulfillment at Jesus second coming. What does it mean to have the Holy Spirit? (See John 3:5-7; Rom. 8:9-10; Gal. 5:22-25)

4. Pray for government leaders both locally and globally.

#### **Friday: Ezekiel 37:1-14**

1. Who do the dead bones represent?

2. Who brings his people back to life?

3. What was one of the signs God had "resurrected" his people Israel? (vs. 12)

4. Pray for family and friends.

#### **Saturday and Sunday**

Review what you read in Ezekiel this week. Pray for those serving Christ faithfully and pray for the services on Sunday. Pray the prayer of Ephesians 3:13-21.
