



### **Monday: Jeremiah 1**

1. Jeremiah's prophetic ministry was forty years long, from the reign of Josiah in 627 B.C., the last good king of Judah, and finished in 587 B.C. when Jerusalem fell to the Babylonian king Nebuchadnezzar. What do you learn about God from vs. 4-5?
2. How would you summarize the dialogue between Jeremiah and the LORD regarding his special call to be a prophet for God? (vs. 6-11)
3. What did God promise Jeremiah about his prophetic ministry? (vs. 8, 18-19)
4. Missionary of the week: Pray for Tim & Patti Long as they train pastors at the seminary, support the planting of new churches, and teach at a special needs school in Mexico.

### **Tuesday: Jeremiah 2:1-19**

1. The priests, the shepherds, who are the kings, and the prophets were to be God's spiritual leaders for Israel. How did most of them treat the LORD? (vs. 8)
2. What are the two evils God says his people have committed against him? (vs. 13)
3. What happens to people when the fear of God is not in them? What's the direction of their life? (vs. 5, 11, 19)
4. Pray for people in your Oikos or in your "5 for 5".

### **Wednesday: Jeremiah 2:20-37**

1. How does the LORD remind his people of his goodness to them? (vs. 20-21, 31)
2. How have the people responded to his goodness and love for them? List as many as you find.

3. Israel's theology about God is similar to people in our culture today (vs. 35). What is the similarity, and what is God's response to this kind of attitude?

4. Pray for people where they work and live that they would honor God in all they do.

#### **Thursday: Jeremiah 3:1-14**

1. After the reign of king Solomon, Israel split into two nations. The northern kingdom, composed of the ten tribes, was called Israel, and the southern kingdom of Judah. What is the spiritual idolatry of these kingdoms likened to?

2. What does God want from his people? How are they to follow him? (vs. 10)

3. What does God say it takes to get back into right relationship with him?

4. Pray for government leaders both locally and globally.

#### **Friday: Jeremiah 3:14-25**

1. God must judge Israel for their sins, but he also cannot break his promises. What is the beautiful promise the LORD gives to Israel? (vs. 14-18)

2. What is the relationship God desired with his people and what was their response? (vs. 19-20)

3. What is involved in having a repentant heart towards the LORD? (vs. 21-25)

4. Pray for family and friends.

#### **Saturday and Sunday**

Review what you read in Jeremiah this week. Pray for those serving Christ faithfully and pray for the services on Sunday. Pray the prayer of 1 Thessalonians 3:9-13.
