

Monday: Jeremiah 22:1-10

- 1. What is the command the LORD has Jeremiah deliver to the king, his officials, and the people he rules? (vs. 2-3)
- 2. What is the blessing for obedience and what is the warning for disobedience?
- 3. What will be the reason for Judah's calamity?
- 4. Missionary of the week: Pray for Orange County Rescue Mission as they meet physical needs and share Christ in our community.

Tuesday: Jeremiah 22:11-30

- 1. In this section God has a special message of judgment to three kings of Judah. Each king was a son of king Josiah, who was the last good king of Judah. Shallum, also known as Jehoahaz, reigned three months after his father Josiah died in battle fighting the Egyptians. What was God's message of judgment for Shallum? (vs. 11-12; See also 2 Kings 23:31-33)
- 2. The judgment for king Jehoiakim, who followed Jehoahaz, and was the king during the first Babylonian invasion is found in vs 13-23. What is the judgment coming to him and why?
- 3. The judgement for king Coniah, also known as Jeconiah and Jehoiachin, who followed Jehoiakim, and was king during the second Babylonian invasion, is found in vs. 24-30. What is the judgment coming to him?
- 4. Pray for people in your Oikos or in your "5 for 5".

Wednesday: Jeremiah 23:1-15

- 1. Who does the LORD pronounce "woe" upon, and why?
- 2. What is the bright hope for Israel's future that the LORD promises to them?

- 3. The prophets, priests, and kings all had a responsibility by God to lead the people by his statutes. What became of the prophets and priests in this passage?
- 4. Pray for people where they work and live that they would honor God in all they do.

Thursday: Jeremiah 23:16-40

- 1. What are the lies prophesied by the false prophets and who pays attention to their words? (vs. 16-17)
- 2. What is the power of God's word? (vs. 28-29)
- 3. What are some examples of false prophets or teachers today?
- 4. Pray for government leaders both locally and globally.

Friday: Jeremiah 24

- 1. Jeremiah has this vision after the second Babylonian invasion carried out by king Nebuchadnezzar. Who do the good and bad figs represent?
- 2. What does the LORD plan to do with the good and bad figs?
- 3. What does this vision teach you about the character of God?
- 4. Pray for family and friends.

Review what you read in Jeremiah this week. Pray for those serving Christ faithfully and pray for the services on Sunday. Pray the prayer of Colossians 4:2-4.
