



### **Monday: Jeremiah 25:1-14**

1. When Jeremiah received this word from the LORD, how long had he been doing his prophetic ministry, and what was the result?
2. God was going to use king Nebuchadnezzar as his instrument to judge Judah, and who else?
3. How long would Judah be in exile, and what would happen to Babylon?
4. Missionary of the week: Pray for Transformation Ministries as they plant new churches, equip pastors, and support ministries in our association of churches.

### **Tuesday: Jeremiah 25:15-38**

1. Though God did judge Judah, and its nations surrounding them, this passage expands to a universal judgment. What does the cup of wine represent? (vs. 15-16)
2. What are the words or phrases which show the mightiness of God?
3. Why must God punish wickedness?
4. Pray for people in your Oikos or in your “5 for 5”.

### **Wednesday: Jeremiah 26**

1. This moment in Jeremiah’s life happened early in the administration of the second king he served. What do you learn about the LORD from vs. 3-6?
2. What was the initial reaction the people had to Jeremiah’s message? What did they ultimately decide, and why?

3. Two godly prophets, Jeremiah and Uriah the son of Shemaiah, both delivered God's word, but Jeremiah's life is spared, and Uriah is killed. How do we make sense of that? (See Jer. 1:17-19; John 21:20-23)

4. Pray for people where they work and live that they would honor God in all they do.

#### **Thursday: Jeremiah 27**

1. What does the LORD declare of himself to Israel and its surrounding neighbors? (vs. 5)

2. God puts forward the results these nations will face for their obedience or disobedience to his word. What are the results for obedience and disobedience? (vs. 8-11)

3. Jeremiah had already been through two Babylonian attacks and here he warns of a third attack. What is Jeremiah's plea with his people that reveals his frustration with their sinful hearts? (vs. 13, 17)

4. Pray for government leaders both locally and globally.

#### **Friday: Jeremiah 28**

1. Zedekiah was the last king of Judah before his kingdom was destroyed by king Nebuchadnezzar and the people carried off in exile to Babylon. The king prior to Zedekiah was his nephew Jeconiah (also Jehoiachin) who Nebuchadnezzar deposed of and carried off to Babylon in the second deportation. What is Hananiah's "good" word from the LORD?

2. How did Hananiah's word directly contradict Jeremiah's prophecy, which directly contradicted God's word?

3. Why do you think the LORD judged Hananiah and took his life so quickly?

4. Pray for family and friends.

#### **Saturday and Sunday**

Review what you read in Jeremiah this week. Pray for those serving Christ faithfully and pray for the services on Sunday. Pray the prayer of 1 Thessalonians 3:9-13.
