



Monday: Jeremiah 41

1. What was Gedaliah's political mistake? (See also Jer. 40:13-16)
2. Historically, the Ammonites were enemies of Israel, but at this time they both saw Babylon as the enemy. What was so godless about Ishmael's actions, and why do you think he did what he did? (See also Jer. 27:1-8)
3. Why do Johanan and the people stay near Behthehem?
4. Missionary of the week: Pray for Turkish Connections International and Dr. Richard Freeman as they lead the planting of new churches throughout Turkey and sustaining strength for local pastors.

Tuesday: Jeremiah 42

1. What is the challenge for all of us as it relates to following the LORD? (vs. 6)
2. What were the blessings for obedience and the consequences for disobedience God gave the remnant?
3. What did the people promise Jeremiah and what did Jeremiah discern in their hearts? (vs. 5-6, 19-21)
4. Pray for people in your Oikos or in your "5 for 5".

Wednesday: Jeremiah 43

1. Previously Johanan looked heroic, but what shows him to be like everyone else? (See also Jer. 38:3-4; 36:22-25)
2. Why do you think the people did not obey the LORD even when he gave them a clear answer? (See also Jer. 17:9; Isa. 53:6)
3. How will the LORD continue to use King Nebuchadnezzar?
4. Pray for people where they work and live that they would honor God in all they do.

Thursday: Jeremiah 44:1-14

1. What do people often forget about practicing evil against God? (vs. 7)
2. What did the people who came to Egypt not stop doing?
3. What is God's plan for these refugees who rejected his grace in chapter 42-43?
4. Pray for government leaders both locally and globally.

Friday: Jeremiah 44:15-30

1. How do the people respond to Jeremiah's word from the LORD?
2. What are the people deceived about?
3. What do you learn about God's word? (See also Ps. 119:68; Isa. 40:8; 55:10-11; Matt: 24:35)
4. Pray for family and friends.

Saturday and Sunday

Review what you read in Jeremiah this week. Pray for those serving Christ faithfully and pray for the services on Sunday. Pray the prayer of Philippians 1:9-11.
