



Monday: Jeremiah 45-46:12

1. Baruch was the scribe for Jeremiah's ministry. When Baruch experienced trouble early on in his ministry how did he react?
2. What does God's response communicate about himself, the times Baruch was living in, and ourselves?
3. Pharaoh Necco had caused much trouble for Judah (For more see 2 Kings 23:28-36). What did God know about the heart of Egypt and what was his response to it?
4. Missionary of the week: Pray for Wayne and Katheryn Niles as they share Christ, equip local churches, and meet physical needs of people in the Congo.

Tuesday: Jeremiah 46:13-28

1. How is the LORD's judgment of Egypt similar to his judgment of Judah?
2. What in the text shows this judgment involves both physical and spiritual warfare?
3. What shows God to be faithful to his promises to Israel?
4. Pray for the people in your Oikos or "5 for 5".

Wednesday: Jeremiah 47-48:11

1. What shows the LORD to be a mighty warrior against the Philistines?
2. What in the text shows God's judgment on Moab involves both physical and spiritual warfare?
3. What do you learn about God from reading this section?
4. Pray for people where they work and live that they would honor God in all they do.

Thursday: Jeremiah 48:12-33

1. Ancient Moab was east of the Dead Sea and today would be located in the nation of Jordan. Chemosh was the Moabites national deity, who they sacrificed their children to. What are the sins of Moab in this passage?
2. God again declares himself King. (vs. 15; See also Jer. 46:18)
Why does God declare himself king in these prophecies of judgment?
3. What do you learn about God from reading this section?
4. Pray for government leaders both locally and globally.

Friday: Jeremiah 48:34-47

1. What is the emotional reaction the LORD has to those experiencing judgment? (see also Ezek. 18:32; 33:11)
2. King Nebuchadnezzar was God's instrument of judgment against Moab. Why does God issue judgments against nations? (vs. 42; see also Isa. 26:9-10)
3. What is the long-term future for Moab? (vs. 47)
4. Pray for family and friends.

Saturday and Sunday

Review what you read in Jeremiah this week. Pray for those serving Christ faithfully and pray for the services on Sunday. Pray the prayer of Colossians 1:9-14.
