



Monday: John 9:1-12

1. Remember from the opening prologue of John, it says Jesus was full of grace and truth. What about this scene shows Jesus being full of grace and truth?
2. The disciples think of this blind man much like Job's friends thought of his plight, that God must be punishing him because of some sin. But what does Jesus say? This man's condition isn't to display God's judgment but what?
3. What did the blind man do to receive his sight?
4. Missionary of the week: Pray for Rainbow Acres as they care for and equip for ministry physically and mentally challenged adults.

Tuesday: John 9:13-34

1. Where Jesus is from and his true identity continues to be a focus in John's gospel. Jesus' work he performed on the blind man created division amongst the Pharisees. What were they divided over? (vs. 15-16)
2. What were the blind man's parents fearful of? What does this suggest about the cost of following Jesus?
3. What are the ironies of the Pharisees conversation with the blind man? (vs. 24-34)
4. Pray for people in your Oikos or in your "5 for 5".

Wednesday: John 9:35-41

1. The blind man goes from knowing very little about Jesus, to thinking Jesus is a prophet (9:17) to recognizing Jesus must be from God (9:31-33), to belief in him as what?

2. Jesus sums up the point of the healing in vs. 39. How did Jesus words prove true in the spiritual sense for the Pharisees and the blind man?
3. How was the Pharisees hardness of heart proven?
4. Pray for people where they work and live that they would honor God in all they do.

Thursday: John 10:1-21

1. In the OT Israel is portrayed as sheep and the shepherd was a king, a godly leader, like Moses, or God himself who led the flock. What do the sheep, the true people of God, recognize about the shepherd?
2. What does it mean for Jesus to be “the door”, the entrance for the flock?
3. What does it mean for Jesus to be the “good shepherd” of the sheep? (See also Ezek. 34:1-24)
4. Pray for government leaders both locally and globally.

Friday: John 10:22-42

1. How do the sheep of God, of Jesus, respond to him as shepherd?
2. What is the promise Jesus gives for following him?
3. What infuriated the Jews, who are the religious leaders in this scene, and how does vs. 39 support Jesus’ claim in John 10:17-18?
4. Pray for family and friends.

Saturday and Sunday

Review what you read in John this week. Pray for those serving Christ faithfully and pray for the services on Sunday. Pray the prayer of Ephesians 3:14-21.
