



### **Monday: Mark 10:1-12**

1. Why did Moses allow divorce certificates to be issued into Israel's civil law?
2. On marriage Jesus teaches what God's law was from the beginning of creation. What is God's ideal for marriage?
3. What do you think is the bigger picture Jesus wants the Pharisees to understand?
4. Missionary of the week: Pray for Gary and Kelly Yoon as they share Christ with international students here in the States.

### **Tuesday: Mark 10:13-16**

1. What does this passage and the following verses teach you about Jesus' heart towards children? (See Mk. 6:39-42; 9:25-27, 35-37, 42)
2. Why is Jesus "indignant" with his disciples? (See also Mk. 9:33-37)
3. How do children and adults receive the kingdom of God?
4. Pray for the people in your Oikos or "5 for 5".

### **Wednesday: Mark 10:17-31**

1. What is the first commandment, and how was the rich man in violation of it? (See Ex. 20:3)
2. What is Peter concerned about?
3. What is Jesus' encouragement or promise, in his answer to Peter?
4. Pray for people where they work and live that they would honor God in all they do.

### **Thursday: Mark 10:32-45**

1. This is the third time in Mark Jesus predicts his death and resurrection. What role do the religious leaders of Israel and the Gentiles play in Jesus' death?

2. How is the scene with James and John's request of Jesus, similar to the disciple's debate over who's the greatest? (See Mk. 9:34-35)
3. What situations require paying a ransom? What was the ransom price Jesus paid? What did he ransom people from?
4. Pray for government leaders both locally and globally.

#### **Friday: Mark 10:46-52**

1. Even though Bartimaeus was physically blind, what was he not blind to spiritually?
2. How do the people react to Bartimaeus and how does Jesus react? What does this teach about the people's values, versus Jesus values?
3. What showed Bartimaeus truly believed Jesus was the Messiah?
4. Pray for family and friends.

#### **Saturday and Sunday**

Review what you read in Mark this week. Pray for those serving Christ faithfully and pray for the services on Sunday. Pray the prayer of Colossians 4:2-4
